GRADUATION AND RETENTION RATES

From AU13-SP15, 16 students graduated from the Master of Landscape Architecture Program and all but 1 graduated within 4 years (94% graduation rate within 4 years). The one student who did not graduate in 4 years completed a dual degree program. From AU13-SP15, we have had 22 new students enroll in our program and out of that 22, 3 students did not complete the program (86% continued in the program).
