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Credit Hours and Requirements

Students intending to graduate in 2 years should complete an average of 15 credit hours each semester to meet the 60-hour total. It is not required that students complete 15 credit hours each term.

CRPLAN 6200 and CRPLAN 5001

Students must complete either CRPLAN 6200 Graphic Visualization or CRPLAN 5001 Introduction to GIS (or both). If both are taken, one will count towards elective hours.

Studio Courses

Students are required to take at least one studio course during the second year. Each studio is 6 credit hours.

- CRP 6920 Urban Design/Physical Planning Studio
- CRP 6950 Transportation Studio
- CRP 6960 Sustainability Studio
- CRP 6970 International Development Studio

Electives

- In addition to the listed core courses, a minimum of 29 credit hours of graduate-level electives must be taken to meet the 60-hour total.
- A minimum of 15 elective hours must be taken within City and Regional Planning. Exceptions to this policy are made for students pursuing dual degrees.
- Courses taken outside of Clty and Regional Planning must be at least 4000-level (and taught by a professor or lecturer) and CRPLAN courses must be graduate level (5000 level and above).
- Electives are listed in the curriculum for clarity but may be taken at any time as long as the total hours are met by graduation.
- A minimum of 18 credit hours of elective must be graded courses (up to 12 hours of S/U courses may be counted).

Internship Requirement

Students must complete an approved internship experience prior to graduation. Students unable to complete the internship requirement due to full-time employment, family obligations, or other circumstance approved by the Graduate Studies Chair and Internship Coordinator, shall complete a supervised field experience (Practicum CRP 8300). All students must complete at least 2 credits of CRP 6191S Professional Development.
