<p>B. Internship: student internships are the keystone of the MCRP program. Student satisfaction with their placement and their experience is an indicator of student achievement. According to the exit survey to which 33 of 169 responded to the survey,</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● 75.8% of students were satisfied with the internship program (very satisfied or satisfied).

Student Achievement

- 70% of the students who graduated 2-5 years ago (academic years 2015-2018) are employed in planning or planning-related position, and 3% are still looking for a planning job. 36.4% are currently working at the local, city, and county level, 15.2% at the regional and state level, 18.2% working as private consultant, and 21.2% of some other type of planning organization.

D. Graduate Satisfaction (exit survey)

- 66.7% of students reported that they were satisfied or very satisfied, and 12.1% of the students reported that they felt neutral about their overall experience in the MCRP program.

E. Comprehensive Exams

- For the 2019-2020 year, 29 of 29 (100%) MCRP students passed the comprehensive exam.
