<b>Student Achievement</b>			
<p><b>A.</b> The program used a 2021 survey of alumni who graduated 2-5 years ago (academic years 2016-2019) to find out whether the program adequately prepared them in the core competencies for professional practice. 20 of 77 responded to the survey (26 % response rate).</p> <p><i>Respondents rated their agreement with the statement "The program adequately prepared me to...":</i></p>

<p><b>B. Internship:</b> student internships are the keystone of the MCRP program. Student satisfaction with their placement and their experience is an indicator of student achievement. **Student Achievement**

- 91.3% of the respondents who graduated 2-5 years ago are employed in planning or planning-related position, and 8.7% are still looking for a planning job. 30.4% are currently working at the local, city, and county level, 17.4 % at the regional and state level, 17.4 % working as private consultant, and 4.4 % of some other type of planning organization.

**D. Graduate Satisfaction**

- 90 % of students reported that they were satisfied or very satisfied, and 10 % of the students reported that they felt neutral about their overall experience in the MCRP program.

**E. Comprehensive Exams**

- For the 2020-2021 year, 16 of 16 (100%) MCRP students passed the comprehensive exam.
