

## BACHELOR OF SCIENCE IN LANDSCAPE ARCHITECTURE

Students must complete LARCH 2300\* and LARCH 2310\* prior to applying to the major. EARTH SCI 1121 and MATH 1118 (or equivalent) should be complete or in-progress at the time of application. Major applications are reviewed at the end of each semester, and the core sequence of major courses begins in autumn semester of Year 2. Minimally, a cumulative GPA of 2.75 is recommended in order to be competitive for admission to the major.
