GRADUATION AND RETENTION RATES

From AU12-SP14, 18 students graduated from the Master of Landscape Architecture Program and all but one graduated within 4 years (94% graduation rate within 4 years). The one student who did not graduate in 4 years completed a dual degree program. From AU12-SP14, we have had 44 students enrolled in our program and out of that 44, 6 students chose to discontinue their enrollment in the program (86% continued in the program).
