The program used a 2018 survey of alumni who graduated 2-5 years ago (academic years 2013-2016) to find out whether the program adequately prepared them in the core competencies for professional practice. 38 of 108 responded to the survey (35.2% response rate).</p> <p><i>Respondents rated their agreement with the statement "The program adequately prepared me to...":</i></p>

<p>B. Internship: student internships are the keystone of the MCRP program. Student satisfaction with their placement and their experience is an indicator of student achievement. According to the exit survey to which 27 of 27 MCRP students who graduated in Spring 2018 responded,</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 74.1% of students who participated in an internship were satisfied with the internship program (very satisfied or satisfied).

C. Other measures to define student achievement:

- 89.5% of the students who graduated in Spring 2018 had already secured a position or obtained admission to an educational program prior to graduation.
- 100% of students planned to find a job related to their degree after graduation.

D. Graduate Satisfaction (exit survey)

- 59.3% of students reported that they were satisfied or very satisfied, and 18.5% of the students reported that they felt neutral about their overall experience in the MCRP program.

E. Comprehensive Exams

- For the 2017-2018 year, 34 of 34 (100%) MCRP students passed the comprehensive exam.
